Section K: Comprehension (Open-ended) (20 marks) Read the passage below and answer questions 71 to 80.

Two security officers pulled a prank to get back at their supervisor but it backfired and landed them in jail. Yesterday, Ahmad Ibrahim, who had previous cheating and theft convictions, was jailed 36 months and Jamal Yussof was jailed 30 months for making a bomb hoax at the Singapore Airport Terminal Services (Sats) on August 12.

The men, both 31, had placed a sealed cardboard box labelled "Explosives 1.5" at a guard post at Sats Maintenance Centre 2. Deputy Public Prosecutor, Loh Weng Tee, offered the court an account of the prank and how it had gone wrong.

The pair had chanced upon an empty cardboard box which was used for storing bullet cartridges when they were on duty at the guard post. The box, with a label "Explosive 1.5" tacked to it, had been left behind by an absent-minded security officer.

Jamal Yussof suggested that they play a trick on their 52-year-old supervisor,
Mr Karu Vellasamy. He filled the box with newspapers and placed a ticking clock inside
before sealing it. They then called Mr Karu to inform him of their find. Ahmad Ibrahim
smiled and agreed to play along.

Both denied knowing where the box came from when their supervisor asked them.

"They wanted to see Mr Karu's reaction when dealing with a suspicious item," said DPP

Loh.

Mr Karu, suspecting that the box contained real explosives, alerted his superiors.

The area around the guard post was immediately cordoned off and all employees at the maintenance centre in Changi were evacuated.

Bomb disposal officers were called in and they eventually opened the box, only to find newspapers and a clock inside.

Ahmad Ibrahim and Jamal Yussof were questioned by police the next morning and

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both stuck to their story, insisting they had found the sealed box outside the guard post.	
It was only later in the afternoon that they eventually confessed they were	25
responsible for the hoax.	
Yesterday, Ahmad Ibrahim's lawyer, Mr Ronnie Tan, explained there had been	
tension between his client and Mr Karu.	
Ahmad Ibrahim and Jamal Yussof wanted to test how Mr Karu would cope with an	
emergency and came up with the prank. However, what was originally meant as a prank and	30
a joke had turned out to be a complete nightmare, blown totally out of proportion and had	
landed them in hot soup.	
District Judge Bala Rudy said, "There is no doubt that both of you had induced panic	
and your actions had wasted valuable resources." He added that such behaviour must be	
deterred.	35
