

Read the passage below and answer questions 31 to 35

At 14, student Teoh Chin Yao is the youngest person to be commended for an act of public-spiritedness this year. The shy Secondary 2 student from Northbrooks Secondary took time out of his September holidays to help the police nab a snatch thief on Wednesday afternoon. Yesterday, he was commended by the police and received a plaque.

The teenager was helping out at a friend's mobile phone accessories stall in Yishun at about 1.30 p.m. when he heard a woman shout, 'Robbery!' He saw two men dash past him and recognized the second one. An employee of a joss-stick store nearby, he was chasing the first man.

Said Chin Yao, 'Suddenly, he tripped and fell.'

Without a moment's hesitation, he started running after the first man.

Two police officers driving in their patrol car along Yishun Ring Road noticed the boy. They stopped their car, got out and joined in the chase. After about 70 metres, all three caught up with the thief, and the officers handcuffed the 37-year-old unemployed man. They found a knife in his back pocket and also recovered a \$470 mobile phone, which he had dropped during the chase.

Police said that the man had gone to a mobile phone shop and asked to see the phone. He ran off after a sales assistant handed it to him.

Said Chin Yao of his experience, 'It was a little bit scary, especially when I found out that he had a knife.'

'But after this, I think I want to be a policeman too.'

'I'm glad you brought the blanket. We can use it to haul away the bones.' Shauzia ignored Parvana's objections. 'Come on. We'd better hurry or we'll get left behind.' She obediently fell in behind Shauzia as they ran to catch up with the boys.
