Joseph Loy had been a practitioner of taichi for a few years when he came across a book entitled "ChiRunning" in a bookshop last year. The author of the book, Danny Dreyer, promised a revolutionary approach to effortless, injury-free running.

Dreyer, a well-known running coach in the United States, had studied taichi for many years and believed the concepts that he had learnt could be applied to any sport. While most people believe that the key to running and injury prevention is muscle strength, Dreyer is convinced that strength training does not help the underlying cause of most injuries – poor running form. In applying a taichi principle that "less is more", Dreyer moves away from the convention of "no pain, no gain".

With his daughter Lisa's NAPFA test coming up, Joseph decided to buy the book and use it to help his daughter achieve a good timing during her 1.6 kilometre run. He imparted Dreyer's advice of having the correct posture while running to his daughter and was surprised to see the difference after a few runs. "After using some of the techniques taught in the book, my daughter's timing improved by two seconds. She also did not feel the usual breathlessness after the run and was able to recover faster," Joseph stated proudly.

He has since discovered other ways in which Dreyer's philosophies have helped in his daily life. "It makes you more aware of your posture, especially if you work long hours in front of a computer or sit still for too long. It also helps with backaches," he added.

With the knowledge gained from the book, Joseph has realized his dream of keeping fit in a shorter period of time. He mused, "As you grow older and the family gets bigger, you find that you get less and less time to keep fit. ChiRunning has helped my exercise routine establish maximum efficiency."

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During that short period when American clipper ships reigned supreme, people not much different from you and me, occasionally performed tasks that can only be described as heroic. One of these is the story of Mary Patten and Neptune's Car.

Mary Ann Brown was 16 years old when she married Capt. Joshua A. Patten of Rockland, Maine, in 1853. Patten, at 26 years, had already proven his mettle as a man of fine character, as well as a skipper who made fast passages. As a result of this reputation, he was offered command of the extreme clipper Neptune's Car, after its first captain took ill. Patten accepted the job with the understanding that he could bring his bride with him although it was unusual for wives to accompany their husbands on passages.

Neptune's Car was 65 metres, drawing 7 metres with a 12 metre beam. It displaced 1,616 tons and was launched in 1853.

On their first passage to San Francisco from New York, Neptune's Car raced the extreme clipper Westward Ho. After a passage of a little more than 100 days, Neptune's Car pulled into San Francisco only 5 hours behind Westward Ho. The ships then raced to Hong Kong, and this time Neptune's Car beat Westward Ho by 11 days. It was on this passage that Patten began teaching his young wife the rudiments of navigation, a skill she soon excelled at and one that would prove invaluable.

In 1856, Neptune's Car departed New York, once again bound for California. This turned out to be a difficult passage. The first mate was found sleeping on watch and, against the captain's orders, had repeatedly shortened sail while the captain was asleep. As a result, Patten locked the mate in his cabin and advanced the second mate to the position. Unfortunately, the second mate was ignorant of even the rudiments of navigation. Thus, Patten was forced to stand watch continuously without sleep, until he collapsed from "brain fever". He eventually grew delirious and could not command the ship.

Nineteen years of age at this time, pregnant and facing a sick husband. Mary Patten took command of the ship. Mrs. Patten assembled the men on the deck, told them of her husband's condition and asked them to stand by her and Mr. Hare. For the next 50 days, Mary Patten had little rest between navigating and caring for her beloved husband. During this time, the captain seemed to recover but then lapsed back into sickness that was compounded by deafness and blindness. How Mary Patten managed is almost beyond comprehension. But she managed, and after 136 days, Neptune's Car passed safely through the Golden Gate.

The Pattens took the train back east, and the shipping company gave her a gift of \$1,000 for saving the ship and crew, a paltry amount, although the value of the cargo exceeded \$350,000. Not long after her son was born, her husband passed away. Mary did not live long, herself, dying at the age of 24 from tuberculosis. Till this day, Mary Brown Patten is known as "The Florence Nightingale of the Seas".

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
