- 2 How important is the contribution of **either** archaeology **or** epigraphy to our understanding of ancient Greek economic life?
- 3 What of social or economic significance can be learnt from **either** Greek painted pottery **or** Greek literature?
- 4 In what visible ways was social differentiation marked in ancient Greek society?
- 5 The full household consists of slave and free (Aristotle, Politics 1253b). How adequate is Aristotle's definition of a Greek oikos!
- **6** How important were the social functions that religion performed in ancient Greek society?
- 7 Prohibitions are the best guide to what matters in a society. Discuss with reference to the ancient Greek world.
- 8 How important was money for trade in the ancient Greek world?
- **9 Either** (a) What can be known of the practice and imperatives of Greek agriculture outside Attica?
- **Or** (b) How far were slaves used in Greek agriculture and why is an answer to this question important!
- 10 Assess the non-citizen contribution to the economic life of Greek cities other than Athens.
- 11 Who benefited from either war or trade in ancient Greek society?
- 12 How important was mobility of labour in ancient Greece?
- 13 In what ways did Greek cities attempt to control **either** the economic **or** the religious life of their inhabitants?
- 14 'The greatest glory of a woman is to be least talked about by men' (THUCYDIDES II 45.2). In what ways other than childbearing did women play a significant role in ancient Greek society?
- 15 'Bread and salt, wine and water.' Examine the role of eating and drinking together in the ancient Greek world.
- 16 How political was sport in the ancient Greek world?
