- 4 The 'ambiguity' of slavery.
- 5 Is the tyranny of the paterfamilias a myth?
- 6 What new dimensions do Christian sources bring to the history of childhood?
- 7 Were pagan Romans systematically indifferent to the poor?
- 8 How did Christians respond to the apparently radical social teaching of Jesus?
- **9** How do the medical sources reflect prevailing attitudes to women in Graeco-Roman society?
- 10 Assess the contribution of either the legal sources or art to the history of one or more of the disadvantaged groups in Roman society.
- 11 How and why did the role and value of Roman citizenship change in our period?
- 12 Either (a) Did Rome's subjects 'become Roman'?

 Or (b) Discuss and explain the representation of bandits in the literature of our period.
- 13 Either (a) How did religion reinforce the power structures of Roman society?
- **Or** (b) Account for the different responses of the Roman state to Jews and to Christians.
