- 2 Without texts the archaeologist can tell us little. What is the contribution of archaeology to the study of Rome and the Greek East. (You may, if you wish, limit your answer to either the Greek East or the Roman West.)
- 3 Assess the importance of **either** epigraphy **or** numismatics for the study of relations between Rome and the Greek East.
- 4 How helpful a concept is the 'language of power' for understanding relations between Rome and the Greek East in the period from Pyrrhus to Sulla?
- 5 For the subjection of kings and the acquisition of peace' (LIVY XL 52). What was the nature of Roman imperialism?
- 6 Who made foreign policy in Rome in the period down to 146 B.c.?
- 7 What role was played by 'freedom for the Greeks' in the period from c. 220-146 B.c.?
- 8 Assess the impact of Rome's eastern experience on **either** the economy **or** religion in Rome and Italy in the period from Pyrrhus to Sulla?
- 9 How far does the Roman triumph illuminate changes in the relationship between Rome and the Greek East?
- 10 Roman culture was effectively Greek culture. Discuss.
- 11 In what ways can legislation in Rome be used to assess the results of Rome's eastern conquests?
- 12 Was Cato the Elder anything more than 'a boring old Roman moralist?
- 13 In what ways was the city of Rome changed as a result of Rome's foreign conquests!
- 14 What difference did Sulla make to the Greek East?
- 15 How satisfactory are Pyrrhus and Sulla as marking the bounds for a study of Rome and the Greek East?
