- 1 What do we know about social structures and identities in the Neolithic Aegean?
 - 2 How different was the phenomenon of social complexity in the EBA Cyclades from that of the EBA mainland or Crete?
 - 3 To what extent have excavations provided evidence for the 'Achaeans' and 'Trojan war' of Homer?
 - 4 How would you explain the rise of state systems on Crete during the Middle Bronze Age?
 - 5 How intensive were the interactions between the Aegean and Near East in **either** the Protopalatial and Neopalatial periods **or** the Mycenaean palatial period?
 - 6 Can we speak of 'colonization' by the Minoans?
 - 7 Either (a) Describe and explain the 'religious landscape' of Protopalatial and Neopalatial Crete.
 - **Or** (b) How far have the sites of Phylakopi and the Mycenae Cult Centre illuminated 'the archaeology of cult' in the Mycenaean world?

8 Either (a) What do we know about political hierarchy in the Minoan and Mycenaean worlds?

Or (b) Explain the social and cultural significance of the artefact reproduced below.



- 9 What do the Linear B tablets from Pylos and other palaces tell us about the nature of the Mycenaean economy?
- 10 Can we explain the emergence of elites on the Greek mainland in MH III-LH I?
- 11 Is the end of the Mycenaean palaces best explained by reference to some kind of natural disaster?
