

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- 1. To what extent did the United States rejection of the Treaty of Versailles mark the end of American internationalism and the start of isolationism in the 1920s?
- 2. How far was the Great Depression responsible for Japan's aggressive foreign policy in the 1930s?
- 3. To what extent did British policy after 1929 contribute to the Arab-Jewish conflict in Palestine?
- 4. What factors produced tension in the Grand Alliance during the Second World War?
- 5. Did military victories or political success contribute most after 1945 to the Chinese Communist victory in the Civil War?
- 6. Analyse the role of ideology in the origins and early development of the Cold War between 1944 and 1953.
- 7. To what extent did the Eisenhower administration become more committed to disarmament agreements with the Soviet Union after 1957?
- 8. What was Khrushchev trying to achieve in his relations with the United States before 1963?
- 9. 'The Sino-Soviet split resulted from different approaches to revolutions and conflict outside Europe.' Discuss.
- 10. To what extent did the Suez crisis result from the conflict between Israel and Egypt?
- 11. Why was Castro's seizure of power and the initial development of the Cuban revolution so successful?
- 12. Was the CIA orchestrated coup in Guatemala primarily designed to protect American economic interests or prevent the spread of Soviet influence?
- 13. To what extent was the coup against Allende produced by popular resentment of his domestic reforms?
- 14. Analyse the relative importance of the role of MITI in producing Japanese economic recovery after 1949?
- 15. To what extent did **either** the United States **or** the United Nations contribute to the successful establishment of a united Congo by 1963?
- 16. What was Nixon's policy of 'Vietnamisation' designed to achieve and what were its actual results?

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- 17. 'Détente failed because Soviet and American aims were directly opposed.' Discuss.
- 18. Why were the attempts to produce a lasting settlement to the Arab-Israeli dispute unsuccessful between 1957 and 1975?
- 19. Why did Gorbachev's policies contribute to the collapse of the Soviet Union?
- 20. Account for the rise of political Islam.
