- 1. Analyse and discuss the function of the myth of Napoleon in *Le Médecin de campagne*.
- 2. 'Far from being a matrifocal romance, *Eugénie Grandet* is one of Balzac's major patriarchal manifestos.' Discuss.
- 3. 'Histoire de la grandeur et de la décadence de César Birotteau est une œuvre privilégiée en cela qu'elle autorise une multiplicité de lectures.' Discuss.
- 4. 'Puisse une société basée uniquement sur le pouvoir de l'argent frémir en apercevant l'impuissance de la justice sur les combinaisons d'un système qui déifie le succès en en graciant tous les moyens!' Discuss *La Rabouilleuse* in the light of this exclamation taken from the preface to the novel.
- 5. Analyse and discuss the representation of gender in *Illusions perdues*.
- 6. 'Splendeurs et misères des courtisanes presents the reader with a "total" criticism of society.' Discuss.
- 7. Analyse and discuss the representation of marriage in *La Cousine Bette*.
- 8. Analyse and discuss the representation of human and divine justice in *L'Envers de l'histoire contemporaine*.
