Optional subject (m): Nineteenth-Century German Philosophy

Answer <u>THREE</u> questions. You must answer questions on at least <u>TWO</u> philosophers. Avoid overlap in your answers.

- 1. Does Fichte succeed in 'freeing himself from the reflective metaphors of self-observation'?
- 2. 'I posit myself as free. In the same undivided action, I simultaneously posit other free beings' (Fichte). Discuss.
- 3. Was Schelling a pantheist?
- 4. 'That unity which is indissoluble in God must be dissoluble in man and this constitutes the possibility of good and evil' (Schelling). Discuss.
- 5. Assess Hegel's argument that in scepticism consciousness experiences itself as internally contradictory.
- 6. Discuss critically Hegel's claim that self-consciousness 'exists only as something recognised'.
- 7. 'Reason is the certainty of consciousness that it is all reality.' Elucidate and evaluate this claim of Hegel's.
- 8. On what grounds does Hegel argue that 'Spirit must leave behind the beauty of ethical life (Sittlichkeit)'? Is he right?
- 9. Does Schopenhauer succeed in explaining how the same world can be both will and representation?
- Why is it that Schopenhauer's will keeps most of its operations secret from the conscious mind?
- 11. Is Schopenhauer's pessimism justified?
- EITHER (a) Assess Schopenhauer's account of compassion.
 OR (b) Assess Schopenhauer's claims about the value of aesthetic

experience.

- 13. 'It is only as *an aesthetic phenomenon* that existence and the world are eternally *justified*.' How, if at all, does Nietzsche's account of tragedy bear out this thought?
- 14. EITHER (a) Is the judgement that a morality is enfeebling also, for Nietzsche, an assessment of its truth?
 - OR (b) Discuss critically Nietzsche's rejection of the value of pity.
- 15. Assess Nietzsche's view that consideration of eternal recurrence can be life-affirming.
- 16. EITHER

 (a) 'Nietzsche's conception of the self is vitiated by deep contradictions.' Discuss.

 OR

 (b) Is Nietzschean self-creation compatible with determinism?
- 17. 'Later developments in nineteenth-century German philosophy show conclusively that Hegel's belief in Reason is unsustainable.' Discuss.
