- 1. What do we mean by 'enlightened absolutism' in the two Scandinavian states during the period 1770-1809?
- 2. 'In late eighteenth-century Scandinavia, agrarian reform was a revolution from above.' Discuss.
- 3. What were the primary objectives of Gustav III's foreign policy?
- 4. To what extent was Danish foreign policy driven by economic considerations between 1760 and 1801?
- 5. Examine the influence of the French Revolution on constitutional and political thinking in the Scandinavian countries, 1789-1814.
- 6. To what extent did similar motives lie behind the British attacks on Denmark in 1801 and 1807?
- 7. EITHER (a) To what extent can the changes which affected the kingdom of Sweden in 1808-1809 be described as 'revolutionary'?
  - OR (b) Assess the roles of Finland and Norway in international relations between 1807 and 1815.
- 8. 'The emergence of a sense of Norwegian national identity was the result rather than the cause of the events of 1814.' Discuss.
