- b) Explain how traditional planning methodologies have neglected gender. Has gender simply become another tick-list issue to satisfy Western donors?
- 5. What role would the Ministry of Health play in a country which has just decentralised responsibility for health provision to the municipal level? What problems might you expect to see following such decentralisation measures?
- 6. Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of granting greater autonomy to public sector managers. What measures can be taken to retain accountability?
- 7. Explain the rise in popularity of NGOs as a mechanism for service delivery. Do they overcome the problems associated with traditional bureaucracies?
- 8. Has privatisation worked in developing countries? How should privatised industries be regulated if at all?
