SECTION A

- 1. What distinguishes race from ethnicity, nation, faith and language as categories of collective cultural identity?
- 2. Discuss, with examples, your understanding of the relationship between globalisation and 'local cultures'.
- 3. Using historical and contemporary references, illustrate the range of ideas that have been used to define cosmopolitanism.
- 4. In what ways can cultural policy initiatives, particularly when linked to urban regeneration, deal with cultural diversity and intercultural co-existence? Illustrate with examples.
- 5. Why is 'equivalent difference' a key concept in the conceptual framework of 'cosmopolitan development'?

SECTION B

- 6. Can the promotion of a 'common civic conciousness' and of a 'celebration of cultural diversity' be pursued at the same time?
- 7. Explain, with illustrations, how the 'principles' of cosmopolitan development can be translated into elements of a planning agenda.
- 8. For any one of the 'principles' of cosmopolitan development, suggest examples of programmes or projects that advance its agenda, and explain how they do so.
- 9. What recent advances in planning processes and methodologies make it easier to envisage a 'cosmopolitan planning' approach.
- 10. How might cosmopolitan development become institutionalised at local, urban and global levels?
