 Use the method of 'interdimensional' analysis to analyse the complex, multi-dimensional nature of ONE of the following concepts: 'culture', OR 'globalisation', OR 'cosmopolitanism'.

- 2. Using one or more of the prevailing theories of their formation and continuation, how would you characterise the nature of collective cultural identity groups?
- 3. Is there such a thing as 'global' culture, and if so, what is its relation to other existing cultures and identities?
- 4. Discuss the different ways in which culture has been treated in relation to 'development' theory and practice.
- 5. Distinguish concepts of 'race', 'racial', 'racist' and 'racialised' in critical discussions of cultural hegemony, privilege and discrimination.

SECTION B

- 6. What are the connections between civic identity, cultural diversity and the idea of 'equivalent difference' in the concept of cosmopolitan development?
- 7. Explain the significance of the principle of an 'open city' in the theory and practice of cosmopolitan development.
- 8. Using a city or country of your choice, how would you use the principles of cosmopolitan development to critically assess current policies and practices of intercultural relations?
- A wide range of policies, plans and projects can be identified as contributing to implementing cosmopolitan development principles and programmes. Illustrate one such initiative and explain its potential in such programmes.
- 10. What can be done to re-integrate severely divided cities, particularly those where violent conflict has been or is now a factor in the situation?
