- 2. Discuss the investigation of a lytic lesion in the distal femur of a 50 year-old lady who was previously fit and well
- 3. Discuss the type of wear seen in total knee arthroplasty and what designs can be introduced to reduce this.
- 4. A 65 year-old gentleman with a degenerative arthritic hip with known Paget's Disease is admitted for a total hip replacement. Discuss the problems Paget's Disease causes for arthroplasty surgeons and discuss the possible complications and their management.
- 5. Discuss the possible treatment options for an infant who is diagnosed with Talipes Equinovarus at birth.
- 6. What are the risk factors for post-operative infection? Discuss the ways in which peri-operative infection can be prevented
