Q. 2: *Describe a surprising detail or description in each text.**Explain why this detail or description helped you understand an important idea or ideas.***General comments**

Simplistic but shows basic understanding of the specified text ideas (although neither text is fully developed). Somewhat uneven treatment of texts. Text 1 is more accurate to the idea of "prejudice" whereas the idea of racial prejudice is not explained in text 2, although the "loss of innocence" idea is explained (a central idea to the story).

Shows a basic 'describe with supporting detail' structure for each text. Addresses the second part of the question (simplistic but adequate) with an explanation in the last sentence or two of the treatment of each respective text.

This was judged as a "competent Achieve".

To improve:

Text 1: Developing more detail/quotes of how the Burnells and the Kelveys represented different classes in society and why Kezia seemed to want the Kelvey children to see the dolls' house.

Text 2: Explaining the racial prejudice aspect in the story and linking this to the idea of the boy's loss of innocence. (Again, probably a couple more apt quotes).

Linking the two ideas of prejudice more directly by integrating this larger concept in the body of the script. This is attempted in the last paragraph but needs the 'racial' aspect of text 2 explained earlier.
