(1) Way(1) = Involvement in the Pacific

Description = New Zealand Government were involved in the Pacific because of the Trusteeship Council. NZ provided economic aid to countries like Tonga and the Cook Islands.

(2) Way(2) = Renewing links with countries

Description = New Zealand gave foreign aid to countries who like itself was part of the British Commonwealth once.

QUESTION THREE

New Zealand began to change its foreign aid policy in the 1970's due to the fact that the mandates for the countries they supported were finished, and most countries wanted independence, like Western Samoa, who voted for independence in 1962. New was also pushing for self-government. New Zealand used to have links through the Trusteeship council, now was no longer needed. Only Tokelau under the 1948 Tokelau Authority Act still remained under the care of New Zealand, with aid being sent to Tokelau.

Foreign aid now was only distributed to countries in times of crisis (except Tokelau) and many nations who used to receive foreign aid regularly stopped.
