customs and values are shown in these festivals this helps with the understanding and acceptance of new cultures into New Zealand. An example of people realising that we are a multicultural nation is the fern that was drawn by a young Asian New Zealand, this is positive and shows our diversity and will be positive to her as it shows she is aware of her own culture and many others. She shows this in her drawing of the fern and the integration of maori, pakaha, Samoan <sup>etc</sup> designs. Her belief is influenced by a cultural relativism worldview which shows the person as accepting of all different cultures and sees them in ~~the~~ terms of their own merit.

Another reason New Zealand is so diverse is because of the amount of people arriving here from overseas. People are coming for many different reasons including 42% for a change of lifestyle, 32% for environment and also many other reasons. This is causing major changes to New Zealand and the way New Zealanders perceive other cultures. A major group that is migrating here are Asians, Asian ethnicity has doubled since 1991 to 2004. Many of New Zealand's residents were born overseas, 19.5% were born overseas that's a 15.5% increase since 1996. Diversity is seen at a national level as both positive and negative 63% believe diversity is good and it gives a better outlook, 20% believe

There are impacts to New Zealand's society due to ethnic and cultural diversity in New Zealand. These can be positive and negative and can have real significance on society as a whole.

A positive implication is the increased understanding for culture and the decrease in negative stereotypes between cultures. Especially the reduction in prejudice will be very significant to New Zealand society as people from overseas will not feel threatened and at risk from people showing extremism among different racial groups.

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The understanding will also cause better rights and privileges in the workplace as people will not be discriminated against. <sup>(12)</sup> ~~Mariam~~ <sup>Se</sup> A Christian Ethiopian would view this change positively. As she believes that she should stick to her cultural respects and by doing so shaving her hair after talking to her boss they worked out a positive compromise between them. Because of the boss's openness to the diversity the staff are also left benefiting. <sup>(13)</sup> Mariam's Boss believes this is positive as she is being fair and also keeping her staff happy. This is influenced by a liberal worldview where change is positive. The significance to New Zealand society is that it encourages people from other jobs to also practise a positive outlook on diversity which means there will be a happy environment about working. <sup>(14)</sup>

A negative that could come off of racial diversity is racism. Racism is a major problem and can have effects on people psychologically. It would be very ~~be~~ significant to New Zealand society as it can cause racial extremism where people want to hold onto their culture so strongly that they are willing to hurt people to try show their culture is better. <sup>(15)</sup>

Another positive is the understanding

between all the migrants in New Zealand. An example of this is the book 'My name now' <sup>(1)</sup> SE <sup>SE</sup> This shows a unity and bringing together of people and an understanding of the social change. Gail Thomas <sup>(2)</sup> and ~~she~~ believes bringing this book <sup>(3)</sup> is positive. She believes this because as the editor she is bringing real peoples stories to attention to help encourage the understanding of many different cultures. She says "~~it~~ it puts faces, names, hopes, and dreams to the numbers." This is influenced by a humanitarian worldview which values all life and the safety of all peoples life. This is significant to New Zealand society as many people are being introduced to the new cultural/ethnic diversity that is evident here and they can get used to the social change. // <sup>(4)</sup> SSC
